

The WILL foundation is center/orphanage for disadvantaged children based in Chongming Island. Its mission is to give children who are left behind in life a chance to flourish.

It was started in 2006, when Pilar Tan's family took in a foster child, an orphan from Shanxi province. As the mainstream school system in China is ill suited to dealing with children who have special needs, Pilar realized the need for a special learning center.

The WILL foundation is therefore creating an eco-learning center to provide these children with a loving and nurturing environment and a tailored guided program. It wants to encourage their desire to explore, to create and experiment, to find their individual talents and to develop their full persona.

In the long term, the WILL foundation plans to be a sustainable and self-sufficient learning center. It will show the children how to build and maintain an organic garden on the premises to provide food for themselves and for others. The WILL foundation will guide the children to learn how to use their own creativity, talents and skills to become upstanding individuals, able to give back to society.

Rotarian Filippo reports on his experience at the WILL foundation:

It takes one hour by bus from Pudong to the WILL foundations center in Chongming Island, where I have spent 5 days this summer as a volunteer. After coming back from the ChongMing countryside I wish to share with all Rotarian friends my feelings to describe a wonderful experience that I do strongly recommend to everyone.

I will never forget the amazing energy of those 10 little kids, their smiles, sweetness and sensitivity. I did also admired the passion, kindness, love and professionalism of all the staff who take care of the babies.

At the beginning my main task was to teach qi gong to the kids but I was also very involved in daily routine works of the community and I did my best to give good support. This gave me the possibility to be in touch both with 10 little angels but also to better understand how is managed a small Foundation and to see some of the little and big troubles they have to face everyday.

It is the first time in my life that I give my contribution as volunteer to disadvantaged children and at the beginning I was a little worried to make mistakes but all the babies made their best to make me feel at home and at ease. There was a feeling and energy between us. A real and concrete lesson of life ! I do think I'll go there again in the future.

And last, but not least, a special thanks to Pilar and Gloria who gave me the possibility to have an experience that I will never forget.
