If in doubt – eat Japanese at the Hanano, Hongqiao Sheraton

There are many Japanese res-

taurants in Shanghai of various and often changing quality levels. The *Hanano* has been in existence since at least 12 years and has never disappointed. It is well frequented by Japanese business people. Probably also being close to the Japanese consulate ensures a steady stream of native Japanese customers.

The food is fresh and the variety is good, not only Sushi and Sashimi but also good eel, a good selection of Tsukimono, a reasonable selection of sake and, a nice touch, Coke in traditional glass bottles. Service is fast and unobtrusive, also staff seem to be adept at providing advice regarding the best meal combination. The lunch menus are very reasonably priced, evening meals more expensive. This is a restaurant for business lunch and dinner, not a 'romantic'

place though.


