The Rotary Foundation -- Global grants

Global grants support large international activities with sustainable, measurable outcomes in Rotary's areas of focus. By working together to respond to real community needs, clubs and districts strengthen their global partnerships.

Global grants can fund: •Humanitarian projects •Scholarships for graduate-level academic studies •Vocational training teams, which are groups of professionals who travel abroad either to teach local professionals about their field or to learn more about it themselves

How they're funded

The minimum budget for a global grant project is \$30,000. The Foundation's World Fund provides a minimum of \$15,000 and maximum of \$200,000. Clubs and districts contribute District Designated Funds (DDF) and/or cash contributions that the World Fund matches. DDF is matched 100 percent and cash is matched at 50 percent.

Qualification

Both the district or club in the country where the activity is carried out and the international partner district or club must first become qualified before applying for a global grant. Learn more about the qualification process. Your club and district Rotary Foundation chairs can help you plan how to use your District Designated Funds and learn how to qualify your club.

Submitting a successful grant application

Consult with local experts early in the planning process to build a strong project plan and global grant application. The district resource network (see below) can help.

To be approved, your application must clearly describe how your project, scholarship, or vocational training team:

- $\bullet \mbox{ls}$ sustainable include plans for long-term success after the global grant funds have been spent
- •Includes measurable goals
- •Aligns with one of Rotary's areas of focus
- $\bullet \mbox{Responds}$ to real community needs
- Actively involves Rotarians and community members
- Meets the eligibility requirements in the grants terms and conditions

 Applications are accepted throughout the year and are reviewed as they're

Note: Applications for scholars who will begin studies in August, September, or October must be submitted by 30 June.



Highlights from the last meeting

Tonight we were moved to Manho Chinese Restaurant but our regular meeting tradition did not change. The Four Way Test was led by Tiziana and visitors and guests were introduced by Enzo Carrubba. Everyone noticed that in front of each tablemate there was a lovely white bag with 2 apples inside: kind gift by Rtn. Michel DeVriendt in support of Madaifu Children, the orphanage without walls association. During Announcement time upcoming Club events were reminded, such as Xmas Market organized together with Marriott Hotel and the call for volunteers, "Paint a Wall" at YMY activity led by Sam Tung and then Pradeep, Chair or the Election Committee, reminded about our Club Election Day and election way of voting if you are not able to attend next meeting. President Moto-san also reminded the new regulation about RSVP (Check aside).

It was then the turn of Rtn. Tracy Hua for Classification moment. She told us about her Shanghainese roots and how she grow up with a brave and optimistic mum and amazing parents who always respected and supported her decisions. Her career started into sales into an international business company. At that period she got her biggest accomplishment: her daughter! After that she decided to continue her MBA, in the Netherlands, and immediately after her career had its peak period: she became the first female sales person in Greater China into a company, CISCO, where this role is a "menworld", in fact sales it's not an easy job as somebody could think. You need to be able to deal with people, different kind of people, you need to be a good manager and a good leader. So when you see Tracy, you know who you are dealing with: an excellent leader, a wonderful Rotarian!

Happy Money were managed by Alejandro and Linnet and Alex wanted to move a little bit from our tradition making an experiment asking audience to think about the past and find an happy moment form there. Not everyone followed the instruction but it was nice to go back and forth in time. Most of the attendees were now waiting for the "hot" topic about Rtn. Frank Mulligan's trip to North Korea. He visited the country in April 2017 for a sustainable solar water project. The very first impression he got was "Chaos". The very first days he had to pretend he was a tourist cause foreigners can ONLY be tourists, the only way not to give troubles to their partners and guide. Following impression still continued to be about chaos and a strange feeling came over his soul by watching people walking. Finally he got into real world, which motto is "reduce, reuse and recycle". No animals all over the land and far in the landscape, all trees cut down. Locals cannibalize everything. He witnessed the mass mobilization: over 10 thousand people working 6 days a week and the 7th even harder to fix walls and roads, in a kind of nonsense. He finally reached the destination of his trip, the orphanage of Haeju. The sight was desolating due to the high levels of kids deprivation. The installation of solar panels for heaters will provide them a better life and will help preventing some of the diseases. The project works and this is a real accomplishment. It also means that North-Korean are trusting them and they will be able to help more as many other places are more in need, like Hanhung Orphanage where situation is much worst than Haeju.

At the end, after several questions to our speaker Frank, President Moto-san offered a toast to all happy moments shared that night and to those which have not been shared but still in the air. Meeting adjourned.




