RI President for 2021-22 nominated

On 2 October, RI President Mark Maloney officially declared **Shekhar Mehta** the president of Rotary International for 2021-22. The Nominating Committee for President of RI selected Mehta, a member of the Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar, West Bengal, India, in August. He will be formally elected at the 2020 RI Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, and will become president on 1 July 2021.



Mehta acknowledges that current membership trends are a challenge and says that membership development should be Rotary's

highest priority. He believes that focusing on regional plans, successfully transitioning Rotaractors into Rotary clubs, and increasing diversity and female members could yield a 5 percent net growth in membership each year.

Mehta also says that Rotary needs to become more contemporary and adaptable by focusing on partnerships with governments and corporations, expanding partnerships with organizations that specialize in Rotary's areas of focus, and investing in technology.














We had a vibrant regular meeting after the long holidays of China's 70 years celebration.
