Service Project Talk: Inclusion Factory by Thilo Köppe

Based on figures published by the WHO, around 15% of the world's population are dealing with some kind of disability. The Fifth Plenary Session of the 18th CPC Central Committee as a first ever put "inclusive development" on the political agenda of the Five-Year-Plan in alignment with the UN Sustainable Development Goals. Sustainable inclusion of the less privileged part of the population into the society by various means shall be an obligation of each an everyone of us.



In 2014, the Inclusion Factory was founded with the mission to provide meaningful work and personal development options to people with intellectual disabilities (a part of the certainly most less privileged of our society)...as well as with the vision to develop a scalable and reproducible concept making inclusion a viable contributor to the economic success of an organization.

Meanwhile, the Inclusion Factory has proofed the odds and has been recognized by numerous prestigious awards. This light-house project is increasingly receiving public awareness... improving the chance to make our world a better place.

In his presentation, Thilo will take us through the hatching process of the Inclusion Factory, the challenges on the way as well as the future potential of a project, which turned much bigger than initially planned."
