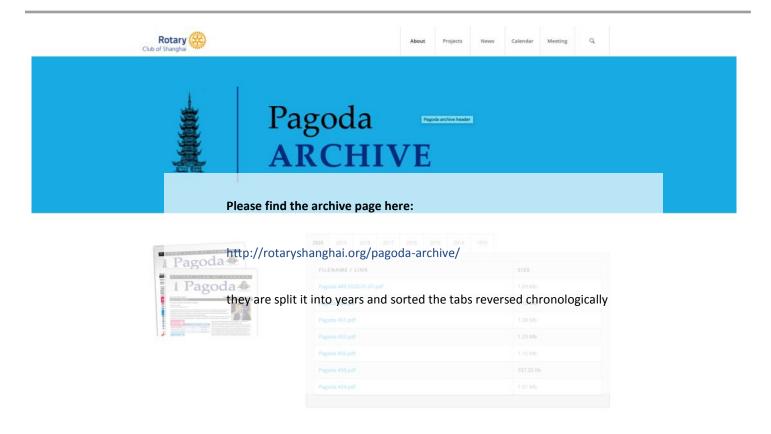
This interactive training will include discussions on how to create an OKR cycle, tips for success, and risks to avoid.
