Club assembly in COVID-19 times are more difficult than normal - and that does not mean that normal club assemblies are easy to organize. Yet PE Thilo as Chair and Master of Ceremonies was very much in charge of proceedings. After Brent had lead us through the Four-Way-Test, Thilo announced a BBQ Invitation from the RC Shanghai West for Sept. 26th, a Mr. Willis Dinner on Sept. 27th, Octoberfest and Family Day on October 16th. Not to forget our next club meeting on Sept. 29th, which will take place in the Guiness Gatehouse.

Markus then made good use of the saddle, collecting 1.400 RMB. And after that an, in these times unusual, occurrence, a new member in our club. Brent Beisher, a former member, rejoined.

Moto presented us with the revised bylaws (4 changes)been extensively discussed, and were unanimously approved. The Club Assembly proceeded with the usual topics of Finance and Admin. PE Thilo in his role of membership committee chair called on all of us to find new and suitable members with special attention to the gender imbalance in our club. We now have 53 members, two new honorary members and 2 applying members. PP Terri introduced to us the CCRC, Circle of Centennial Rotary Clubs, to which we proudly belong and which was formed in February 2020. Globally









Rotary's only growth regions are Asia, Africa and the Middle East, while in other parts of the world Rotary is loosing members - a call to action also for us. PE Thilo called also attention to the point that Rotary Clubs are neither mere business associations - for that we have the AmCham, German Chamber etc., not pure social welfare organisations. Also focus of Rotary and a key attraction is the institution of "fellowship", to be in the agreeable company of like-minded people from all walks of life. Thus he highlighted to ensure that we do not neglect that component of a Rotary Club's function. As a special example he highlighted our first business networking session, which worked out very well and which helps us to integrate more deeply into business, especially with young and aspiring business people. The next meeting is scheduled for October 13th. Topic ideas include digital disruption, decoupling, supply chain changes in the wake of COVID-19, resilience, how to stay on top of geopolitical tensions and how to master the VUKA world.

Further updates during the club assembly included a PR Update (by Natalie) with a family day on Oct.13, Qingpu Old Town on Oct. 17 and more in November and December. A Service Committee update was given by Andrew (Butterfly Kids, Sweat to End Polio, Shanghai Sunrise, Habitat for Humanity). He emphasized that 25% of committed funds were self funded, highlighting the power of Rotary. GOL was updated by Terri: 25 kids received life - changing surgery and preparation for the next Global Grant is ongoing. Two hospital visits for 5 kids are upcoming. Last but not least: Youth Committee (Moto). Moto highlighted three key aspects: Communication, Collaboration and Compliance. Compliance is especially of importance to ensure that we stay within the limits of Chinese law. Moving forward, he was mentioning the extension of Interact to two more schools. Revamping applications together with the district chair and avoiding conflict of interest issues are high on the agenda. In between we also took our time to celebrate the birthdays of David Richardson and Sarah Kochling - CONGRATULATIONS! The meeting closed ahead of time (thanks to Thilo for the good management).

## **Board Training**

Being the first of its kind, our sponsor club, RCS, and its Rotarians graciously took the time out of their busy schedules to deliver to RACS the knowledge needed to effectively operate a Rotary body within the rules and regulations of RI and China.

Various Rotarians showed up and delivered presentations on the various board positions to equip each person serving as an officer with the know-how needed. The training began with YSC Chair Naomy Peña, welcoming everyone then swiftly moved on to District Secretary, Rotarian Tiziana who spoke about the rules of RI from a district level. Afterwards Rotarian Moto- San informed RACS board of how to operate within the laws of not only china but also that of RI. Later on Rotarian Ludovic spoke about how to use RI resources not only for documentation but also for generating logo designs and more. Lastly Rotarian Rita gave a very informative presentation on service and how to go about documenting projects, also how to implement SOPs to track and maintain on going and future projects.

After everyone delivered their presentation, the RACS board had the chance to ask all questions and voice their concerns about anything that was said for clarity and brevity. The climax of the training session had both Rotaractors and Rotarians engaged in a one on one chat where they both could have a deeper understanding of







the roles and responsibilities of each other.

We've gained a better understanding of what it means to belong to the Rotary family in China and globally, and we feel that we can approach our sponsor Rotarians with when in both hard and great times - Cyril, 2020/21 RaCS President.

#### Gift of Life

GOL began in 2000 in China, is one of the longest service programs, 614 children with congenital heart defects have been saved under the program executed by the Rotary Club of Shanghai. GOL provides life-saving operations to young children and teenagers whose family cannot afford the hospital costs. Since the inception of the program, Rotary Club of Shanghai has been awarded by Rotary International 6 matching grants and 3 global grants, with a total funding exceeds US\$ 3/4 million.

On Friday 25th Terri, Carlotta, Markus and his wife have been visiting

4 more kids from the program, all coming from the Yunnan region. A 2 years old boy and a 10 months old girl were already back to the





ward: after a short time in ICU, I'm happy to announce that they are recovering very fast. One girl just arrived to the hospital and will go through all the physical health check-ups before she will be operated after the National holidays. Unfortunatly we couldn't see the boy who's still in ICU, but we left a small present for the parents. The kids were surprised seeing so many unfamiliar people at first, but gaining confidence after a few minutes and offered heart warming smiles and hand waving when we left. Our immense respect all goes to Dr. Wang who has already done around 3000 to 4000 heart operations and saved innumerable kids' lives!
