Chinese students in Japan supporting the Motherland

Jiayi Chen, Rotaractor in Japan

I am a Ph.D. student at Nagoya University from Shanghai. As a Rotaractor, I have been trying to connect Rotary families in Shanghai and Nagoya.

I am also a director of NPO Chinese Association of Science and Technology in Japan whose members are Chinese postgraduates, doctoral students and teachers living in Japan.

In January of 2020, seeing the serious outbreak of COVID-19 in China, the number of confirmed cases is increasing every day, medical supplies are in shortage, we felt worried. Then we hit the idea that we could take advantage of the resource from our network in the 10 universities including Hiroshima University, Hokkaido University, Kyoto University, Kyushu University, Nagoya University, Osaka University, Tohoku University, The University of Tokyo, Tokyo Institute of Technology, and Waseda University.



We conducted the donation activities for 8 days. Medical materials with total value of 183,000 RMB were raised, including 2600 N95 masks, 3800 medical masks, 51 goggles, 500 protective coats, 12360 latex gloves, 700 protective caps, 1700 protective shoecovers, 69 medical spray bottles, 20 infrared thermometer and 86 clinical thermometers. The materials arrived in Huang Gang Central Hospital and Egang Hospital of Hubei Province on Feb.7th, Feb.17th and Feb.29th in batches.

Not only people from China living in Japan, but also other overseas Chinese from all over the world including Canada, Singapore, and Malaysia supported the activity with the passion to help the Motherland.

Ordinary people, acting together, making a difference. This is the sentence I hear from Rotary. Through this activity, I learned that this is true. We will continue to devote ourselves to help the front-line medical fighters against the COVID-19. And we will commit to put every material donated into place to fulfill the mission.

Rotary Club of Singapore held its very first meeting on 6 June 1930. Then, 75 prominent professionals and business people, gathered and chartered Rotary Club of Singapore, what is now the largest and oldest Rotary Club in Singapore.

Since its founding 90 years ago, Rotary Club of Singapore and its Members have contributed immensely to Singapore's nation building. Its key contributions included the setting up of Singapore Anti-Tuberculosis Action and Service, contributing \$250,000 in 1949 to set up Singapore's First Anti Tuberculosis Clinic, the provision of mobile dispensary and blood bank vehicles, the sponsoring the Singapore Association for the Deaf and Children's Convalescent Home, the establishment of a Hostel for Discharged Prisoners, the establishments of the Salvation Army Girls' Home, the Singapore Spastics Association, the Society for the Aged Sick and Singapore Anti- Narcotics Association to name a few.

More recently, Rotary Club of Singapore have been involved with mental health wellness with Club HEAL, rehabilitation of drug offenders in cooperation with Singapore Prisons Service as well as providing guidance and mentorship for the vulnerable youths in our Society. Internationally, through The Rotary Foundation (TRF), RC Singapore has been involved in 140 approved Academic Scholars Grants, Matching Grants and Global Grants.

Gracing the occasion will be the Guest of Honour, Her Excellency, Madam Halimah Yacob, President, Republic of Singapore, and Special Guests, Rotary International President Nominee Shekhar Mehta and spouse Rashi.
