Speech momentum: Carlo Socol briefly introduced himself. He likes to consider himself a "practitioner" who thinks globally and act locally, being where youngest take challenges (school) and help them growing and fulfilling their talents, especially in a country where unemployment affects over 100mln young people. For many it is not easy to enter a good school and because of high pressure, family and society, suicide is one of the leading causes of death of young between 15 and 34 years old. To overcome this social problem specific programs are needed in cooperation with schools, authorities and enterprises. Vocational Technical Schools target is to professionally prepare young migrant people, giving them real competencies for stable work into manufacturing sector, accompany them all along with a methodology that puts the student at the center of the educational activity, enabling them to become proactive and able to contribute to social development. We all liked the citation Mr Socol had at the end of his speech: "We Serve. To Serve is what leaders do best"!

Our meeting then ended with President Moto-san toast to "Fellowship".

This means orphans are hosted in their own village to grown into their environment. They financially support hosting families and the target is to guarantee kids access to high schools. Last Wednesday (October 18<sup>th</sup>), President Moto along with directors Terri Lau, Frank Mulligan, and David Smith traveled to Nanjing to visit the Rotary Club of Nanjing's regular meeting.

The day was a special day for the club as it was the day they chose to recognize their members for their achievements with the symbolic pinning of all members and the elected officers by Charter President Joe Svoboda. The club currently has 16 strong members with regular attendance with another 5-6 that have shown strong interest.

Nanjing is another city in China with a long history in Rotary. The original Rotary club of Nanjing was chartered on January 19<sup>th</sup>, 1934. During the meeting, we learned that during the Nanjing Massacre, there were 3 Rotarians that decided to stay in Nanjing to help in any way they could.

The club is focusing much of their efforts on organizing their first major club event; a 1500 person "Walkathon" tentatively scheduled for next April. While many of the details have yet to be determined, it is sure to be a fantastic inaugural project.

The Nanjing club was started initially through the efforts of President Andrew and David almost a year ago. Although it has not yet reached the 20 members it needs to achieve fully chartered status, with the level of dedication the current members are giving, we can be sure that day wont be long.

Saturday morning, before visiting Yue Miao Yuan Home for Disabled, the idea for this article was quite clear: I'm going to report about facility, numbers and other practical situation. Then I reached the location and met Sam and Michel and we were introduced to the Manager, Mrs. Lyn. We visited the facility and we "inspected" the bathrooms because it is one of Service Committee projects to help them refurbishing them and we wanted to better understand their needs. Residents were enjoying the sunny day having an outdoor activity so indoor visit was quite easy and fast. We started talking about real needs and status of standard residents. Not a single case is alike: different levels and causes of disability, different ages and different family situation. I started feeling deeply touched but I had my coup de grace when we entered the room of most severe cases: it was like a punch in the stomach and my eyes felt something was happening. I had a moment of panic, cause I know you have to be strong in this kind of situations, for many different reasons and I didn't know how to handle my emotions. Suddenly a young resident came to us, smiling and saying 'Hello, ok, ok". He shook our hands and hugged us. My feelings totally changed in a fraction of second. I felt renewed and my heart was full of joy. We were invited to join outdoor activity, so we did. I even played badminton and it was real fun... actually some residents had even more fun cause I know I'm terrible in sports: they really had some comic situation to watch. At the end of the visit we discussed about how RCS could contribute more to support them and we agreed that it could be a good idea to organize a "working day", helping them re-painting the facility and any other good activity will come to our mind is more than welcome. Here is the moral of the story: we receive more than what we give and I touched it with my hands today.
