Angel Children Visit

I am very fortunate to be able to represent the Rotary Club of Shanghai to go visit the kids at the Angels Center in Beijing. The 88 kids are coming from six provinces of China: over half of them are orphans, some are “de-facto” orphans, and the rest came from extremely poor families with no one to take care of them.

The kids are led by the former national baseball team’s captain, Coach Sun, and are given the opportunity to learn about baseball & gymnastics, while taking all of the required grade school classes at the same time, with the hope to create brand new futures for themselves. What folks did not know is that most expenses came

directly out of Coach Sun’s own pocket—although there were some in-kind donations from the kind-hearted corporations—they are in dire need of money to sustain the operation of school.

We hope that with the platform of the Rotary Club of Shanghai, we could gather all of the help & resources from



our friends, to have the 88 kids to continue their journey here and to be able to create limitless future for them.

This event allows Rotarians to support each other in expanding their businesses and provides Rotarians more opportunities to contribute to the Rotary's Community Service Programs.


What is "House of Friendship"?
