2021-2022 RCS Year: a Challenging Year Full of Achievements and Joyful Moments Together

On Tuesday night, Rotarians and Friends gathered for the annual changing of the guard – Handover Night. David had some business to attend to outside of Shanghai, and the Kunlun was still not open, but as they say on Broadway, "the show must go on!"



And so, in room papered with David's face, our Club and our guests gathered to celebrate the end of the Year of Elevated Engagement. The food was fabulous at Azul Italiano in North Bund, and we are so grateful for Eduardo's support again. Peter took us through the 4 Way Test, and the guests introduced themselves to keep the event casual and fun. We did have some business to attend to, namely, showcasing our Club's incredible impact this year.



The Board decided last June to set 3 key goals for the year: 50/50/500: 50% increase in member engagement; 50% increase in membership; and 500,000RMB in impact to our community and our world.

These would be lofty goals in normal times... in COVID times, these were downright ambitious. This Club's members scored!

From supporting community events nearly every month, to adding 17 new members, to incredible

fellowship dinners at the hottest new restaurants, RCS was growing and engaging in Shanghai. We added 1 new Interact Club (Dulwich) and had 1 club receive a Rotary Citation (Shanghai Shangde Experimental School) for the second year in a row. Growing and Engaging – check and check!



And we were impactful! We raised over 170,000RMB in Happy Money, and spent over 250,000RMB with 20 local and international partners across 6 Areas of Focus. We launched 2 internal projects that are agile, online, and available to all members for participation: Kiva Microlending and Career Empowerment Program. Kiva supported 40 projects in 18 countries since January. CEP supported over 60 young professionals and students. Our GOL committee saved over 30 lives this year and expanded across China with projects in Kunming, Chengdu and Chongging. Did I mention we met The Rotary Foundation Goals as well - 100% EREY and 100% sustainable.

We had new project champions, new partner introductions and even new fundraising ideas during

2021-22. From Flood Relief in Henan to the Career Empowerment Program, there was no challenge too big this year. Every member had a chance to shine – to find their passion and bring it forward. And that's the heart of what makes the Rotary Club of Shanghai exceptional and what makes me so humbled and honored to have served for this year.

We had so many fun moments – from our 102nd Birthday to our Christmas Party, our members let their hair down to have some fun! Our little theater and performance group grew from 5 to over 15 at our last show before lockdown. We had inspiring Sweat to End Polio events that kept us energized and healthy. While appetizers were served, we watched a slideshow to remind us of these times that seem so long ago after 4 months apart!



I decided since we were already violating tradition without the presence of the incoming president and not being in our normal venue with a traditional meeting, I'd go for the trifecta and instead of selecting a few outstanding members to thank, I'd thank all. Every member received or will receive a celebratory mug commemorating the Year of Elevated Engagement.
