The idea emerged from Rotary Club Sao Paulo (Brazil), when in 1996 some children assisted in an event of the club, and some of the children were given some tasks. That is when Rotakids started, although at that time it was called KidsAct. A few years later, when Samir Khoury was governor, the first formal foundation was created. The objective of Rotakids is to support the opportunities for the children to organise themselves in groups, practice leadership and receive the basis and

ideals of Rotary with the philosophy being "Serving Play". Stimulating educational values like dignity and respect for others, important and necessary for the forming of a person's character.

A Rotakids club provide various benefits to the sponsoring Rotary Club, the family members start to participate more actively in the club's activities when they are accompanied by the children.

The Rotakids encourage the protection of animals and plants, look after our planet, decrease the litter in our community and recycle, the participation of the family members and promote international goodwill.

Presently there are 169 Rotakids clubs in the world, in 72 Districts of 23 different countries, with a total of 3,445 Rotakidianos. The countries with a greater amount of Rotakids clubs are Brazil (recall that it is the country where Rotakids was first established) and Great Britain. The Rotakids Club

Highlights from the last meeting


