

Entrepreneur and Ultramarathon Runner Greg Nance will share how he's actively cultivated interests and turned them into his profession and calling. He'll speak on lessons learned ranging from boyhood forest exploration to high school debate days, the startup journey, and mindset required to run some of the toughest footraces on the planet including the Gobi Desert and Antarctica.

Greg Nance is working to expand education access. Greg is the CEO of Dyad.com, a mentorship platform that has helped students earn over \$27M in scholarships. He is also the Chairman of Moneythink, an NGO providing 15,000 low-income teens with financial capability to boost college success. His work has been recognized by The New York Times, World Economic Forum, and President Obama as a "Champion of Change." Greg loves endurance challenges and has solo climbed Mont Blanc, swam across the Nile River, and run 7 marathons in 7 days on 7 continents. He holds the Fastest Known Times for a run on Shanghai's Bund Riverside Trail and for a run between Hongqiao and Pudong airport.

After the meeting was adjourned by the traditional toast by Terri, majority of the members stayed late for more fellowship.















On Thursday night Board Director Paul Denver was on a flight home from a trade mission in Europe when he was hit with agonising kidney stone pain. On landing in Hong Kong he was taken to a public hospital by ambulance and finally got some pain relief, then was transferred to a private hospital.



Meanwhile PDG David Egan was able to contact Michel De Vriendt (Pictured, centre, with wife Michelle and Alain Chevassis-More at the District Conference) from the Rotary Club of Shanghai who in turn contacted President Adrian of RC Hong Kong Island West who was in France, and Terri Lau, President of RC Shanghai who was in Hong Kong on Rotary business. President Adrian is a cardiac surgeon and contacted local surgeons in Hong Kong. As a result of these contacts Dr David Chu was waiting to see

Paul when he was transferred to a private hospital. As extra backup, RC Adelaide member Zing Tan also has a convenient sister-in-law with Hong Kong contacts who spoke to Lee to offer any assistance needed. And all this in the middle of the evening.

In the event Paul was initially discharged from hospital, but after more tests he was readmitted for further treatment and has to be cleared before he can fly home. Fingers crossed on that one.

Parts of messages from Paul:

"Thank you so much for what you and so many others have done. Rotary is truly amazing. A specialist [Dr Chu] was waiting at the private hospital ... we see him again in a few hours. We will spend all today thanking all who have been involved. Thank you so much again.

"Rotary connections made it all happen so quickly and bypassed all barriers or relays. ... Doors opened for consults, admission, scans and ops. ... They have all been contacting Lee, including the pilot, to make sure we are OK."
