## **Bolivia Recap**

At the height of the pandemic in May, Rotaract joined hands with The Cactus Bar and Restaurant, Saslsame Mucho the organizers of "Dance for Bolivia Latin Night" who were partnered with NGO Inti Phajsi in Bolivia to raise funds in order to send aid to Bolivians in need of supplies.

The supplies in need were masks and other sanitizing supplies to help against the battle with COVID-19. Miguel Angel, Rotaract`s representative and project lead along the entities mentioned above were able to raise a sum of 7,500 RMB from the Latin Night event with the help of RACS PR & Marketing Director Lareesa with her diligent work on the marketing strategies used to help gain





the interests of more people and get the event across to bring in a crowd.

RACS Community Service Director Linda also gave a helping hand in getting the event on the right track. With her diligence, Linda helped diffuse the flyer onto various social media hubs and local portals such as smart shanghai to get the awareness about the Latin Night event out there.
