Yoneyama China Alumni- a part of Rotary family with the spirit of Service Above Self



Yoneyama China Alumni Association held annual party at Jing'An Kunlun on January 16, 2021, attended by 56 members, family and guests offline and around 20 members online.

Rotary Yoneyama Memorial Foundation is a project of the Rotary Districts in Japan, originated by Rotary Club of Tokyo in 1952 to commemorate the achievement of Umekichi Yoneyama, "Father of Japan's Rotary".

Until June 2020, Yoneyama Foundation has sponsored 21,624 foreign students from 129 countries or regions studying in Japanese universities. Among them, more than 1/3 is from Mainland China.

They have also been supporting a rural school in Gansu continuously since 2015 to commemorate an alumnus Chai Shengfang, County Mayor, who passed away from hard work at his age of 45, who helped establish the school.

Due to the restriction to visit the school under COVID-19 policy, Yoneyama China Alumni decided to hold online event to donate two desk top computers and scholar-ship for 9 kids leaning at the school on October 22, 2020.

Yoneyama China Alumni meets annually, inviting Rotarians from Japan, for fellowship and strengthen the ties each other and with Rotary.

In this year, due to the international travel restriction, Japanese Rotarians could only attend by sending video messages.

I was invited to the annual party by my old friend, President Xiao Huijie, who is a Rotarian from Rotary E-Club of District 2750 Tokyo Yoneyama to witness the moment.

There were some alumni attending from Japan online. One of them was Chen Jiayi.

She is a Rotaractor in Nagoya, who visited RCS in March 2018 when I was the President. She brought a group or Rotarctors from Nagoya to participate in Run In Blue in November 2019 and she is working on the first Run In Blue event in Japan this year. Thanks to her dedication, our Rotaract Club of Shanghai plans to establish a sister club relationship with a Rotaract club in Nagoya.

She has also been active in COVID relief locally in Japan.

Her dedication, although 100% made remotely during the year of 2020, deserved an award of "active participation".



An alumnus shared his history of the first batch scholars from Mainland China in 1989.

At that time, the amount of the scholarship was 34 times of average salary in China. The scholarship not only supported his study a lot, but also gave him great opportunity to integrated into Japanese society with hands-on support by the local sponsor club and Rotarian mentor.

The alumni association is a very loose group including old boys from 30 years ago to young adults just graduated in Japan spreading all over the country and in Japan. You can imagine the difficulty of the operation including collecting dues and election etc., perhaps much more difficult than that of RCS.

The daughter of an alumnus, 11 years old, showed a splendid Chinese traditional song on stage with the highest confidence, who says that she wants to be a lawyer. This is a true example that Yoneyama Alumni is fostering new generations with the spirit learned from Rotary long time ago in Japan. At the end of the annual party, I was invited to make the closing remarks.

"Let me share my Rotary experience here in Shanghai. Every time when I was asked What is Rotary, actually, it was not easy to answer. Rotary is a kind of study group. Yes, it's true. We have guest speakers at regular meetings. Rotary is a kind of fellowship group. Yes, but not just fellowship. Rotary is a kind of charity organization. Yes, we do charities, but we are not purely a charity. Rotary was established in Chicago in 1905 and continued 116 years. There is a reason why this group is such a long lasting. I think Rotary is a kind of platform for people who want to do something. I heard today that you initiated an online donation





for the school project and reached the target only in half a day. I also heard that you created a new style of 10km walk together from multiple locations. I do believe Yoneyama Alumni Association is exercising the Rotary spirit here. So, my answer now for What is Rotary is that it is a platform for you to utilize to do something. It is the same for this association. I hope everyone can participate in developing this great platform and grow with it. I wish you a happy new year of 2021.
