Will farm permaculture, a small farm with a bigger cause

Pilar tan, was born in Taiwan, raised in Spain, and lived in the United States for over 25 years. She moved to shanghai with her family in 2005. After she settled in shanghai she felt the need to reach out to those in need. Specially those who had less opportunities to be heard.

In her talk you will understand how she reached out to help the disadvantaged and how she and her team has created the permaculture farm to help them become self sustainable, plus giving opportunities to those who needs help and teach them how to lead. Lastly thru the permaculture project she has reached out to the community and aims to teach and inspire to further understand the impact that it has from the permaculture farm to our earth, by understanding our precious soil to the next level.

Rotary International and Toastmasters International Cooperation

As some of you may know Rotary International and Toastmasters International (an international public speaking club existing for nearly 100 years) are cooperating with each other on an international level. One of the new initiatives of this year's presidency under @David | President | 22-23 is to also strengthen our bonds with Toastmasters locally here in Shanghai. So we have invited them to do a sharing and small interactive fast forward demonstration of a Toastmasters session during 11 October's Rotary Club dinner. In the future we plan to also have Rotarian do a sharing at a Toastmasters meeting. In fact, one of our past presidents and still very active Rotarian (meanwhile outside if China), Randal Eastman, was one of the co-founders of the very first Toastmasters Club in Shanghai, Shanghai #1 Toastmasters club and also Pudong Toastmasters club back in 1998/1999. Meanwhile over 800 clubs have been founded all over China. In Shanghai alone we have more than 100 clubs. One of the most prestigious and successful clubs in China is Leadership Toastmasters Club and we have invited them to give a sharing at our 11 October RCS dinner.

I also am member at the Shanghai Leadership Toastmasters Club since 2017 and can say that it has helped me a lot for my profession as an Executive coach, trainer, and workshop facilitator. The presentation skills you gain just by joining, participating and of course also holding prepared speeches goes far beyond what you can ever learn in some presentation skills trainings. Bringing across an inspiring message and telling



a story that captures the audience attention is certainly a skill that is beneficial for any Rotarian. By the way, one interesting fact. Did you know that according to a survey the biggest fear of people around the world is speaking on stage in public. The second biggest fear is... death! Stay tuned for the sharing session on 11 October and you will have the chance to go on stage and hold a two minutes impromptu speech.
