Child abuse and neglect are highly prevalent in all societies and common to all cultures. The life-long impact is often extremely severe for the individual, and is pervasive throughout society as a whole. Safeguarding children is everybody's responsibility. Across the world, we all have a responsibility to demonstrate awareness, advocate for children in need and respond proactively when children are at risk. This presentation is a 'call for action' for us all: a call to seriously consider the needs of the most vulnerable people in our communities, to take shared responsibility and to save lives.

Fiona Yapp MA., is the Clinic Director at The Essential Learning Group, Shanghai. She manages a multi-disciplinary team of over twenty therapists and psychologists, providing a full range of assessment and therapeutic services to children and adolescents in need. Fiona is a fully qualified Child Protection Social Worker from the UK, who has worked in local government safeguarding services across England.

Her experience to date has been focused on investigating and responding to the most serious cases of child abuse and neglect, initiating legal care proceedings and forcibly removing children from abusive home environments. Most recently she has been developing and utilising practice models for effective safeguarding in the international community of Shanghai.
