

Shelley Bragg has worked in the areas of marketing, events, fundraising and social development and has worked with various organizations over the past 14 years, in various countries. She is currently the Director of Marketing and Development at the Western International School of Shanghai (WISS). She is the founder of Still Chasing Rainbows an organization aimed at supporting nonprofits and cofounder of Good Travel a social enterprise that is using tourism to encourage environmental sustainability, community action and ethical business practices. Within her time in Shanghai, she has coordinated and run the annual tours to China for the Kliptown Youth Program (who had visited the RCS as well), a nonprofit in South Africa. They have traveled to China 5 times as part of a fundraising and awareness tour. She has also worked with local organizations such as JiuQian Holding Hands Centre and Pathways of Hope. Her years at WISS have also brought forward worthwhile initiatives. WISS has an extremely active and unique focus on Community Action and Service. They have partner organizations such as Couleurs de Chine, Stepping Stones, the Kliptown Youth Program and they have started, built and funded the development of a school and clinic in rural Cambodia.

Shelley has spoken at various events and offered training sessions on the topics of marketing, fundraising, compassion and in support of the various organizations she works with. She believes in the power of the individual to make a difference in the lives of many, and she recognizes that the key to creating change is through the education of our youth in a way that develops the whole child.

Update on Handicapped Workshop

The handicapped workshop project in Taicang is gaining traction. On November 3rd the second group of disabled workers started their training & assessment. Feedback from the first group has been extremely positiv from various angles: high motivation of disabled workers, parents sending us thank-you notes, great satisfaction of customers with the labor quality provided. On November 10th, we received the official business license for the workshop. After a thorough tendering process, a construction company has been contracted with the renovation of the final workshop location. The renovation will be completed by end of December allowing an official opening of the handicapped workshop by end January 2015. To date, apart from numerous hardware donations cash donations of CNY1.5M could be collected. The German State investment bank DEG is currently in the verification process to fund the project with an additional EUR200K at minimum. Next milestone is the development of a paperless shop floor management system and the recruitment of additional customers.
