A Brief History of the Rotary **Movement in China**

The Rotary Movement in Greater China began October 1st, 1919, when the Rotary Club of Shanghai was admitted to Rotary International, as the second Rotary club in Asia. By 1949, 43 Rotary clubs had been established across China, in 39 Chinese cities and 5 districts. However, these 43 clubs have not been existing simultaneously due to the rapid changes in the political and social environment. 2 districts were dissolved by Rotary International in the fall of 1941 and the remaining 3 on July 1st, 1951. By January 1952, 39 Rotary clubs had been terminated by RI, in accordance with the provisions of the Rotary International Constitution and Bylaws. The remaining 4 of them still carry on functioning until today: The Rotary clubs of Hong Kong (1931) and Kowloon (1948), the Rotary Club of Macau (1947) and the Rotary Club of Taipei (Taipei) (1948). The number of Rotary clubs in Taiwan, Hong Kong and Macao has been growing continuously over the past decades. By January, 2015, there were: 641 clubs in the whole of Taiwan; 55 clubs in Hong Kong; and 6 clubs in Macao

In 2006, Rotary International decided to admit further clubs in Mainland China. As at 1 July, 2015, there are 7 Rotary clubs established in Mainland China located in 4 cities, Shanghai, Beijing, Chengdu and Suzhou

During the last century, 4 outstanding Rotarians from China served Rotary International in the world leadership team: Dr. Fong Foo-Sec (Shanghai) - Rotary International Director 1933-1934; Dr. Yen Te-Ching (Nanjing) - Rotary International Director 1941-1942; Dr. Chengting Thomas Wang (Chongging) - Rotary International Director 1944-1946, and as concurrent 2nd Vice President 1945-1946; Mr. George Ernest Marden (Hong Kong) - Rotary International Director 1951-1952. In the new Millennium, Dr. Gary C. K. Huang (Taipei) served as Rotary International Director 2000-2002 and Vice President 2001-2002; he was later elected RI President 2014-2015. Representing the Chinese regions, Mr. Jackson S. L. Hsieh (Taipei Sunrise) served as RI Director for 2 years 2008-1010. In 2015-2017, Mr. Frederick Lin (Taipei Tung Teh) is serving RI as a Director.

Frank Yih selected to become Rotary's Special Representative to China

John F. Germ, the incoming RI President, has selected Frank Yih to succeed Randal to represent Rotary China in lieu of a District Governor as of July 2016. Randal will assist Frank in his job as Deputy Special Representative. Congratulations on the nomination, which entails responsibility for trainings for Club officers and leaders, , supporting clubs in China, , provide leadership to Clubs in China and support Rotary's extension in China.
