Council on Legislation

In the early days of Rotary, any change in the By-Laws or the Constitution was proposed and voted on at the annual convention. As attendance in conventions increased, and open discussion became more difficult, the Council on Legislation was created in 1934 as an advisory group to debate and analyzes proposals before they were voted on by the convention. That means the inaugural Council on Legislation was held in connection with the 25th Rotary International Convention at Detroit, Michigan, USA, on 25-27 June, 1934. Finally at the 1970 Atlanta Convention, it was decided that the Council on Legislation would actually become the legislative or parliamentary body of Rotary, until today.

Now, every 3 years, Rotarians meet at the Council on Legislation. The Council gives us a voice in how our organization is governed. The next Council convenes April 10-15 2016, in Chicago.

Each Rotary district sends an elected representative to the Council. Representatives deliberate and act upon all propo-sed enactments and resolutions. Enactments seek to change Rotary's constitutional documents, and resolu-tions express an opinion or make a recommendation to the RI Board. The RI Board reviews and acts on resolutions adopted by the Council and items referred to the Board.

Though clubs in the Republic of China were not yet districted, Dr. Fong Foo-Sec (鄭富灼博士) (see photo) was selected as China's representative to sit in the Council. Dr. Fong was the Shanghai Rotary Club President in 1931-32, and served Rotary International as a director in 1934-35. He was the first Chinese who served as a "lawmaker" in the Council of Legislation.
