My trip to North Korea - Frank Mulligan

Frank Mulligan recently visited North Korea as part of a 10-year continuing support program for North Korean orphanages. Supported by Rotary Clubs from around the world, the program has built a trusting relationship with our North Korea partner, expanding from a single orphanage in Pyongyang to five orphanages all around the country.

Successfully completed projects have included solar ovens, solar heaters, pharmaceuticals, solar lights and food plants solutions. Most recently the program installed a number of solar heaters in the Haeju Orphanage in the south of the country, and plans are currently in place to install Kitchen Gardens in each of the five orphanages.

Given the level of deprivation in North Korea, the impact of these projects goes far beyond the norm for humanitarian aid. Frank will share his experiences and impressions of this closed society, in so far as anyone can.

Visitors and guests were introduced by Christian Rink and traditional banners exchange this night was with RC Queenstown, RC Yangon and RC Singapore.

He told us how his Rotary life started from his personal experience of knowing of Polio then he introduced the Rotaract mentorship program, giving 4 reasons why Rotarians should apply for becoming a mentor. After his explanation President Moto-san signed up!

Monthly Birthday celebration had two representatives: Rtn. Mark Hunziker and our speaker Dr. Ioana Kraft

Clue moment of the evening: Dr. Ioana Kraft - China Manufacturing 2025 / Putting Industrial Policy Ahead of Market Forces speech. She offered several data about the decrease of European investments in China because of market access restriction but also due to lack of reciprocity in market access. She told us about the CM2025 Plan announced by Premier Li Keqiang in March 2015 which takes into consideration 10 key sectors. She showed us the Policy Toolbox with its main 5 points and the domestic and international market share targets by 2025 and their consequences. Recommendations for future China market are to move forward with domestic market – based reforms and support free trade and allow market share to be determined by competition, not government targets. On the other hand recommendation for European Business are to align long-term plans with China's industrial upgrade, to keep innovating to stay ahead and monitor state-steered mergers and acquisitions. Lots of questions came out after the speech and the replies showed a kind of pessimistic vision of Iona about the future. We then ended by our traditional toast offered by President Moto-san for a Win-Win relationship.
