Night Program: Fred Young ~ Organic Farming and Rainbow of Hope



Formerly an English teacher and real-estate consultant, Fred Young is a passionate individual with an inspiring dream. He spends most of his time promoting his vision of ecocommunities enriching both urban and rural lifestyles, and teaching others about farming, community organizing, and NGO management. In the future, Fred hopes to spend more time nourishing, coordinating and educating the farm community. The first youth of his village to graduate attend university, Fred retired from the corporate world in 2008 and fearlessly

returned to his hometown in West Hunan, giving back to his community by creating an organic farming business and the Rainbow of Hope program. After 10 years relentless explorations for the effective solutions to the issues with his home village, which is harassed by depression in both economy and culture, and with help from various experts, scholars and other passionate individuals in eco sustainable development, the holistic solution of Urban-Rural Bridges came into shape. Urban-Rural Bridge (UrB) addresses the issue of imbalanced development between urban and rural areas which is caused by the gaps between urban and rural areas in information, technology and economy. UrB bridges, empowers and cares for urban and rural communities with concrete knowledge, techniques and tools that are computerized into the UrB app. The UrB app empowers farmers, especially those small ones, to deliver quality work to meet the solid demands of the rural communities which are developed by UrB city community organizers.





