Roy Delbyck collects printed materials on China and Hong Kong, largely from the first half of the 20th century. His collection comprises books, maps, photographs, letters, diaries, posters, postcards, directories and other ephemera. It continues to grow. Daily!

Roywill not only talk about what he collects, he will also speak on the what and why of his collection, how his collecting interests have changed over time, the fish that got away and the items he would grab in case of a natural disaster, while exploring the nature of collecting and how private collectors fill in the gaps, often going where institutions can't.

What motivates Roy are the stories behind and between the items he collects. We look forward to his stories, especially those regarding pre-WW2 Shanghai which occupies a major place in his collection. He will also highlight collection materials on Rotary and Rotarians. When not collecting, Roy is a US customs and trade lawyer with his own firm in Hong Kong where he has resided for many years. He is trustee of the Museum of Chinese in America based in New York and has served as a Vice President and Governor of the American Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong.

Roy has spoken on collecting and his collection at the Hong Kong branch of the Royal Asiatic Society, Hong Kong University, City University of Hong Kong and the Yale Club of Hong Kong. Photographs and other materials from his collection have been exhibited at Hong Kong University and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.




