#### Lorenzo Riccardi: China and International Tax

China has signed 102 double taxation agreements of which about 60 of those were signed with countries involved in the Belt and Road project. China has also launched new tax reforms in 2019 for companies and individual to boost internal demand and economic growth. International Taxation focuses on the complexity of multi-jurisdiction regulations and different tax systems, gaining new opportunities from International Taxation knowledge and transfer pricing.

During his presentation at the Rotary Club of

Shanghai meeting on June 11, 2019, Mr. Riccardi will address main issues in China 2019 tax reform with a specific focus on International Taxation, double tax conventions and tax planning techniques to minimize the tax burden on income and profits, and to understand tax laws and regulations affecting cross-border transactions.

Lorenzo Riccardi is the Managing Director of RsA Asia (rsa-tax.com) and teaches at Shanghai Jiao Tong University and has been Adjunct Associate Professor of Taxation at Xian Jiao Tong Liverpool. He is a CPA specialized in international taxation and has covered roles in the governance of non-profit organizations and multi-national companies including the largest Italian groups in luxury, food and mechanical sectors. He has published extensively on foreign investments in developing and frontier economies.



## Gift of Health—Funding Released



On May 28, 2019, Rtn. Michel's efforts to release RCS funding for The Gift of Health service project was successful—after 3 years of hard work and and cooperation with Rotary clubs around the world.

The Gift of Health has been an approved project for RCS since 2016-17 Rotary Year. The project focuses on eliminating Kashin-Beck's Disease from the Qinghai Tibetan plain. KBD is a bone stunting that results from malnutrition in children.

Eight clubs from seven countries are involved: Rotary Club of Shanghai, RC Chongqing, RC Adelaide Australia, RC Mayenne France, RC Golden Mile Hongkong, RC Bonn-Rheinbach Germany, RC Spa-Francochamps Belgium, and RC Okd Montreal Canada contributed, along with a special donation from Patrick Boot, honorary member of RCS. The donated 31,200 US-Dollar will be used to fund 15 greenhouses, tools, seeds, training and field assistants for the farmers and resettled nomadic communities in Qinghai's Hainan and Heidong prefectures. By educating and creating sustainable nutrition sources for 250 families, and emphasizing the importance of nutrition in children, Rotary Club of Shanghai has hopes to eliminate KBD completely. RCS has been partnered with the KBD Fund since 2010, and through the Fund's 25 years of work, the disease has been reduced from affecting 30 percent to 3 percent of the region's population.

Many thanks to Rtn. Michel for this labor of love and to Rtn. Alain who has worked tirelessly on this since the beginning. Their perseverance and never ending supply of passion for this project will yield benefits to the people of Qinghai for years to come.




