# Highlights from the last meeting

Our August 24th dinner was a dive into Rotary fundamentals. The meeting began with Rotarian Tilman Rieger reading the Four-way test and President Rita informing new members on our mission, goals and diversity.

### **Learning about the Rotary Foundation (RF)**

Our internal speaker Rotarian Tiziana Richiardi educated us on the scope and services of the RF. Covering the RF within 20 minutes was no easy feat. However, as an experienced Rotary and District Secretary and a previous Vice President, Tiziani is versed in condensing and relaying information to reach the target audience logically and emotionally. Tiziana began by testing our knowledge of a few better-known acronyms of the RF, which long-standing Rotarian Frank Yih thoroughly enjoyed.

We learned a few new ones, and she broke down the purpose of each. The RF employs a complex variety of skills to ensure contributions from Rotary clubs reach the most crucial of social and environmental issues. One such contribution is the Every Rotarian Every Year (EREY), which invites Rotarians to contribute 100 USD per year. Another is the Paul Harris Fellow (PHF), an acknowledgement of Rotarians who have dedicated 1000 USD to a specific need within Rotary International.

To further explain the affordability of these contributions within our context, Tiziana highlighted that an EREY contribution only requires us to give 1.78 RMB per day. With the passion of a dedicated Rotarian, she challenged attendees to consider the impact of our support against the whims we exercise regarding spending. For more information on where and how RF takes action, reach out to the committee members.

### Introduction talks

Dubravka Wenner, sponsored by Christoph Wenner and Tarik Gaertner, transferring from Rotary Club Palatinate Global and sponsored by Jonathan Ortelli, continued their membership application journey but doing their self-introductions.

Dubravka, the wife of RCS Treasurer extraordinaire Rotarian Christoph Wenner, shared their three beautiful children and her impressive international career path and leadership experience. She also introduced us to the German School and emphasized the unique nature of their Euro-campus, shared with the French school in Shanghai.

Tarik shared his service-minded journey, which started from his year abroad in Mexico. He immersed himself in the local culture and experienced their needs. Previously a Rotaract Charter President, he shared some of his former club's initiatives. One notable project supported those in need by providing long term microloans which enabled them to make life-changing moves.

Given their leadership experiences and youth involvement, Dubravka and Tarik will be invaluable additions to our club.

### Happy money and auction

This week, we continued our Happy money and auction contributions to offset the cost of the operation of Run in Blue. Every RMB saved increases our chances of saving more lives through the Gift of Life project. 





# **Rotary China's First Interact PETS**

In the spirit of Elevated Engagement, we bring you an excellent example from Rotary China District. Senior Representative (SR) Richard Zhang and his team appointed the first District Interact Representative (DIR), Interacter Max, from the Interact Club of Shanghai Taiwanese School. To jump-start his role, on August 21st, District held the first Rotary China Interact President Elects Training Seminar (PETS) at the Hongqiao International School.



Students got the chance to connect with Rotarians from the Shanghai West and Gubei clubs. From RCS, Rotarians Moto Yamane (PP RCS), Rita Malvone (P), and Naomy Pena (VP and YSC Chair RCS) were there to support our clubs. We also had invaluable assistance from Andrew Hill (District AG) and Terri Lau (District Secretary).

The breakout sessions focused on the bylaws and the constitutions, which saw Interacters revising their project types and scopes, leadership challenges, and more through inquiry. Through the exchanges, we (RCS) realized the dire need for stronger mentoring within schools. We reflected on supporting other Interact clubs in our District, given strength in our membership and Youth Service.

After lunch, Rotarians from our Youth Service Committee worked with the DIR to help define his responsibilities, aligning with school and RI protection policies and Adviser communication guidelines.
