HAPPY MONEY RMB 1,380.00

Although RCS had a small gathering on 11/8, doomed by yet another wave of Covid lockdowns in town, it was a particularly productive session led by Club President David Smith. We first welcomed Rajat Agarwal to become an official RCS member, introduced by Membership Chair Tilman Rieger. Our long-time guest, Johannes Weilharter, gave us an interesting introduction talk detailing his law background in Austria and his law practice with German firms in Asia over the past few decades.

The highlight of the evening was Tarik Gartner's update of RCS's KIVA micro-lending project. Of the funds lent by RCS on the KIVA platform, only \$25 of the \$2,275 was lost (due to currency exchange rates), and \$1,014 has already been repaid. We then had the pleasure to re-lend that amount to more people in need. Two teams were able to pick and select, on the spot, individuals who had applied for KIVA loans. We were able to lend money to folks all over the world, from Moldova to Rwanda to Paraguay, for the purposes of water sanitation, agriculture, education, etc. All of the members were able to participate in making the lending decisions and to understand more about the KIVA lending process.

We raised RMB 1,380 for happy money that evening. A special shout out to potential member Jennifer Bradshaw for making the bell ring. All of the proceeds go to Rotary International's Polio Elimination Fund for the month of November.
