

#### HAPPY MONEY RMB 9,575.03

This past Tuesday night marked a significant change for Rotary Club of Shanghai. By the end of the evening, members voted to adopt Articles 12 and 13 into our bylaws. The vote was celebrated as a step forward for the club, as we can now welcome honorary Mainland Chinese citizen members as full RCS members! Read on for more details at the end.

"Together, people create change," said President David Smith, summarizing our Rotary values and presiding over this Club Assembly Night. We celebrated Elizabeth, Rajat and Alex's birthdays with a delicious cake, and Tilman inducted new member Rob Sherman, sponsored by David. All RCS members are reminded to invite friends and colleagues who may be interested in joining our service organization!

David reviewed the many RCS committee accomplishments and contributions, which included a number of significant donations and events ranging from blood drives and giving gift packs for families in need, to providing mentoring, sponsorships, gifts for children at Shanghai Children's Medical Center, volunteering at the WILL Foundation, supporting children with EB (Epidermolysis bullosa/butterfly disease), and the work of the Gift of Life Committee, which can use support from members for fundraising and more — reach out to Terri and Jeff to volunteer! Members also received a finance update and a copy of the Rotary China Guidelines, of which #3 was up for a vote to create a path for local citizens to become full members of our club (vs. honorary members).

The Rotary International Convention will be in Melbourne at the end of May. Members are encouraged to attend if they can! Ask David for more information.

More on the vote: The revised guidelines to allow Mainland Chinese citizens to become Rotarians after a six-month honorary membership period were approved by Rotary International. They were adopted by RCS with a vote of 35 yes (including proxy votes), 1 no, and 2 abstentions. The concern was raised that such a significant change to our bylaws should come after more rigorous discussion and study, and that while this is a step forward, some members would like to see us push for full equality in Rotary's acceptance of local citizens. Overall, the mood was celebratory and the change welcomed by full and honorary members alike.
