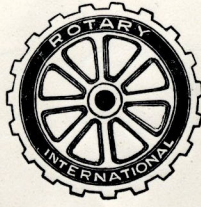

ROTARY CODE OF ETHICS

Adopted by the Sixth Annual Convention:—

"My business standards all have in them a note of sympathy for our common humanity. My business dealings, ambitions and relations shall always cause me to take into consideration my highest duties as a member of society. In every position in business life, in every responsibility that comes before me, my chief thought shall be to fill that responsibility and discharge that duty so when I have ended each of them, I shall have lifted the level of human ideals and achievements a little higher than I found them. In view of this I hold that fundamental in a code of trade ethics for International Rotary are the following principles:

First: To consider my vocation worthy, and as affording me a distinct opportunity to serve society.

Second: To improve myself, increase my efficiency and enlarge my service, and by so doing attest my faith in the fundamental principle of Rotary, that *he profits most who serves best.*
