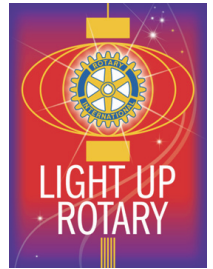

July 15 will be the happiest day of my life. I will start by showing a summary of the RCS services in the past 12 years, a whopping US\$ 2,103,250 and 29 successful projects from 2003 to 2014 in which the Shanghai Clubs share was just \$72,100 and the foundation contributed almost \$707,882. Then I will call upon various Chair persons to talk about their pet projects, namely:

Gift of Life - Our club signature project, the oldest, was started the second day of the Chinese New year in February 2001 by Wingsee, Randal and Frank.

Gift of Fishing Boats to Palonpom - York Zhou will outline it as she is getting up two classrooms in Palonpom South Central School. You all will meet Congresslady Lucy and her delegation including the mayor of Palonpom. I am aiming now at 100 boats with \$50,000 from the China District clubs. This is the first time all Rotary Clubs in China chip in and the beginning of a larger resource pool.

Gift of Sight – a \$46,000 partnership with Warner Robins Rotary in Atlanta Georgia USA. It all began with Dr. Bill Conrad and wife Peggy who tirelessly completed 20 years of cataract surgeries bringing sight to over 5,000 beneficiaries. Our part 2 of Gift of Sight is slightly different but sustainable and deep reaching, by involving Indian specialists to keep the quality high but the cost low. Jeffrey Park of Vision in Practice and his capable assistant Gemma Jiang will present.

Other Gift programs in the making consists of Gift of Smiles - Clefts. Vancouver Rotarian Magdalen Leung proposed to raise \$120,000 to send 35 medical team in October 2015 with the SF based Rotaplast medical team. Gift of Sound – a group of hearing experts from Denver, Colorado USA will come to install about 200 hearing aids to hearing impaired children in second tier cities and conduct speech therapy, in the past mainly done by HuaQiao Foundation, my private no non-sense NGO.

The Club Service Committee presentations were guided by Chairlady Sue Maguire who encourages all of us to get more involved to the committee as service is crucial to our club. We learned that the committee in its first meeting (1st July) accepted 17 projects for this Rotary year and we expect the total to reach 25 during this year with a combined value of RMB 1 Million. What a year!

Nikola Urosevic (Youth Service Committee) shared with us the great

progress youth education in Rotary has made. The success can be seen in several middle schools; yet, many challenges remain: youth is not high on the RCS agenda and requires more budget, while activities compete with abundant Interact activities. His presentation was further enlivened by the accidental appearance of several family photos

At the end of the meeting Tom Thong and Ann Thong generously donated US\$ 2000 to our project Fishing Boat to Palompom, Central Philippines to help recover from Super Typhoon Yolanda in 2013. Thank you very much!
