

# **Providing water to Tibetan villages**

#### **Guest Speaker Tamdin Wangdu**



Mr. Wangdu is humanitarian and avid traveler. Born in Sichuan, he grew up in the Tibetan Autonomous Region (TAR). He went to the US in 1994 where he worked in various positions to support his studies. After graduating from the business school of Boulder, Colorado, he worked in consulting at Accenture and also with several organizations involved in economic support for developing countries.

Wangdu started the Tibetan Village Project (TVP) in 2001. The first target was the construction of a hospital in the village in which his father had passed away, in order to save other lives there. Since then, TVP has worked together with local governments and communities, building clinics, hospitals, greenhouses, drinking water systems and schools. As TVP expanded, Wangdu realized that that his humanitarian vision

requires a sustainable revenue model to keep on going and scale its impact.

Therefore in the last few years Wangdu has focused on developing social enterprises by connecting artisans with markets, promoting community based tourism and providing business consultancy. Most recently, Wangdu has joined "Conscious Impact", a small social enterprise fund that invests in scalable social enterprises in China.

Wangdu describes himself as an "international local" as he loves to travel and lives in two countries, the US and China. He will go wherever his entrepreneurial endavours will take him. Wangdu will speak at our club about his life and the TVP project, especially about two water projects in the Tibetan part of Sichuan, funded by TVP, 'Conscious Impact' and the Rotary Club of Shanghai.

#### Highlights from the Club Assembly

After conclusion of the fellowship the club continued with a general assembly. As President Frank pointed out, this 'mid-year' assembly is meant to give the club an opportunity to review our progress towards the Club's goals and to determine our plans for the second half of the year. A few key messages were as follows:

Treasury (Anthony): Currently >1.5mio RMB in cash of which 0.75mio RMB are reserve. There is a budget of 0.55mio RMB for service projects this years.

Administration (Dean): There is a strong need for guest speakers and all members are asked to actively look out for interesting speakers.

Attendance (Moto): Moto introduced the half-yearly attendance record. The board has decided to follow up with members having low attendance without good cause. If no improvement can be made during the coming half year, membership will not be renewed in July. Service Projects (Michel): All projects and status were introduced.

Rotry China (Randal): Randal reported on the ongoing club expansion projects in China in response to RI President Gary Huang's challenge. Overall there is visible progress, though it will remain a challenge to meet the ambitious targets.

The assembly was concluded at 9:00pm.
