In 1949, the RI Board adopted the slogan "Every Rotarian an Example to Youth" as an expression of commitment to children and youth in each community in which Rotary clubs exist. Serving young people has long been an important part of the Rotary program, since the first decade when a Boys Work Committee was established under Rotary International.

Youth service projects take many forms around the world. Rotarians sponsor Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, athletic teams, handicapped children's centers, school safety patrols, summer camps, recreation areas, safe driving clinics, county fairs, child care centers and children's hospitals. Many clubs provide vocational counselling, establish youth employment programs and promote use of "The 4-Way Test". Increasingly, drug/alcohol abuse

prevention and AIDS awareness projects are being supported by Rotarians.

In every instance, Rotarians have an opportunity to be role models for the young men and women of their community. One learns to serve by observing others. As our

youth grow to become adult leaders, it is hoped each will achieve that same desire and spirit to serve future generations of children and youth. The slogan accepted over 50 years ago is just as vital today.




Restaurant review: Chenglong Hang



Moto's favourite Chinese restaurant is located in Huaihai Plaza. It serves Shanghainese cuisine, including the famous hairy crab. What is especially delightful for foreigners is that you can receive the crab pre-prepared, e.g. with the hard shell removed.

As many chefs come from Jade Garden, the food quality is similar, but with better service level. There is no deposit for reservations, and also no minimum room charge. 3hrs free parking are also included. Cost per meal (excl. crabs) would be 200-300 RMB/person.
