Our speaker Eva Yoo is a Shanghai-based tech writer from Seoul, Korea, who has spent time in both the Silicon Valley and Tel Aviv reporting on tech culture and entrepreneurs. She currently works at TechNode. In the past she wrote for the Korean tech media platform beSUCCESS and served as a marketing manager at Korean startup Nalebe; she also participated in theStarTau Entrepreneurship program in Israel and published 11 startup video lessons with consultant Emma Butin. As part of the business development team at NewsJelly, she won first place in the Silicon Valley Korean startup Demo day. Eva is a frequent speaker at Korean startup communities like Startup Alliance and Business Model Forum and writes her startup survival stories in Israel, Silicon Valley and China on her blog EvaNote. She also hosts a youtube channel, iSUP, where she has interviewed dozens of tech-preneurs. In the past Eva has also volunteered in Ecuador as a Korean language teacher. She speaks Korean, English, Spanish and Chinese.

Wuhan hospital visit

Early morning May 13th we (Tracy, Catalin's wife Raluca and myself) took the train from Hong Qiao to Wuhan. We were welcomed warmly at the train station by a team of the Wuhan Asia Heart Hospital. The 3 hour visit included a professionally produced introduction video, discussion of potential partnership and hospital tour. The 750 bed Hospital was established in 1999. It has performed over 216,000 cases of heart related surgeries and is registered as a national A-Grade hospital for Cardiac Surgery. Afterwards we had to rush to the train station for the 6 hour ride back to Shanghai.

It was a fruitful trip as hospital partnerships are vital to our GOL program. We can work together to save more lives and make a difference to those who would never had a chance.

Highlights from the last meeting

As (nearly) always, President Andrew chaired the meeting. This time the 4-Way Test was read by a Rotaractor, Alexander Ma. Then guests were introduced by David Smith and a banner was exchanged with RC Suburban-Omaha, NE-5650. During dinner, a summary of Run in Blue was given by Rotaractor Gitasha Chand: more than 600 runners and volunteers, raised around 40K in funds for Careers in Care 2.0; great location & professionally organized. Then Linnet gave a report on her May 13 visit to Wuhan to the Asia Heart Hospital to evaluate a potential partnership with the RCS' GOL program. Linnet herself recently donated RMB 3000 to Shanghai Children's Foundation and thus got to ring the bell for 3 times last evening. Kerry Burton, supported by Catalin Lapuste, proceeded to collect happy money. This time it was a Q&A with Kerry asking questions. People who did not exhibit sufficient knowledge were asked to donate, while Kerry, in recognition of superior knowledge, donated himself for every question correctly answered. Alexander Ma also used the time from to sell the specially designed RCS luggage tags (rmb 100 for 2 pieces). The presentation by Holly Sharp on crowdfunding was well received. She focused on the main types of crowdfunding: pledges, donations, equity & lending. Furthermore she elaborated on differences between the YS and China in that regard and lastly she summed up what makes a great campaign: great story + huge fan club. President Andrew ended the meeting with a toast to the future of the Run in Blue.
