# Thoughts on Membership Development

A past vice-president of Rotary International once asked: "What is the most important thing in Rotary? Is it the spirit of Rotary, the program of Rotary, or the internationality of Rotary?

"All three are important," he answered. "But each of them... is dependent upon membership. Yes, the most important thing in Rotary is members. There would be nothing without them, and with them, everything Rotary is and does is made possible."

August, Membership and New Club Development Month, is an appropriate time to discuss a subject so important yet so ignored by Rotarians. Despite modest progress in recent years, worldwide membership growth is not good.

The reasons for poor membership development are many and varied.

For some Rotarians, any talk of membership development conjures up the vision of hordes of men and women queueing up to join a club. They feel the prestige of their membership is being jeopardized and made commonplace.

Others think that their own club, whether it has 20 or 120 members, is the ideal size. Any increase would spoil the happy family circle.

The type of Rotarian often found most disturbing is the one who opposes membership development in his or her own club and equally rejects Rotary extension through the formation of new clubs. Such a person is saying, "We don't want more Rotarians at any price."

Perhaps some Rotarians disinterest themselves in membership development because any influx of keen energetic members bringing with them new life, new views, new interests, and new activities challenges the comfortable status quo.

Above of these, the great enemy is APATHY – Rotarians who never give membership a thought and who are never challenged to do anything about it.

There are men and women in every community possessing all the qualifications for club membership – Rotarians in all but name and club membership, who only a wait the call to join us. They may never receive their call unless one of us decides to a ct.

We do not know what service the new member will offer, what heights they will achieve. The same could have been said about e very president of Rotary International, every district governor, every club president. By your sponsorship of a new member you might well serve Rotary better than you will ever know.

First, we must face up to our own lack of energy in promoting membership growth. Next, we must dosomething about it. Rotary simply cannot be viable in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century if we do not grow.
