Run in Blue 2019 for Leukemic Children's Education; A fun run for a great cause!

Another Run in Blue is right around the corner, so get your running shoes ready! Set to be held on Saturday 18th May 2019, all preparations are underway to make it yet another successful event of Rotaract Club of Shanghai. And this year, we'll be helping leukemic children!

Since 2013, the Rotaract Club of Shanghai (RACS) has been organizing this 5km fun run annually where proceeds go toward children's health and education needs. Proceeds from past Run in Blue events have supported children with autism, down's syndrome and impoverished children. This year Run in Blue is organized by Ultramarathon and RACS to support New Sunshine Charity Foundation (北京新阳光慈善基金会) and their school hospital project, which helps children receive education while they're still in the hospital. Participants can register online at www.alipaobu.com.

New Sunshine Charity Foundation has been working in the area of haematology for 16 years. It is one of the largest Non-Profit Organizations that provides services for patients with cancer, the first NGO to fund medical research in China as well as the first NPO in China to cooperate with World Health Organization (WHO). The project that Run in Blue will help is New Sunshine Hospital School (NSHS).

Each year, between 25-30,000 children get diagnosed with leukaemia or paediatric tumour. About 70% of these children will go back to their normal lives only after 2-3 years since diagnosis. While they undertake their treatment, their peers are growing up and getting education, this means that these children not only have to overcome their illness but also have to overcome the social and education gap between them and their healthy friends. NSHS aims to provide education and social integration to ensure the development of these children. This project started in 2008 with a single volunteer in Peking University and today they have 30 classrooms in 16 cities and over 30 full-time workers. Children are tutored for the main courses of their curriculum and provided with behavioral support. By the end of the illness, the children are free return to their communities as healthy equals!

Each registered participant will be given a special Run in Blue 2019 T-shirt along with snacks and water for the run, and a collector's medal at the finish line. There will be warm up exercises, zumba and salsa dancing, performances and other fun family activities during/after the run. Everyone is welcome to stay behind for personal picnics after the run. Participants currently vary from children to student groups, to sports enthusiasts, and corporate employees doing team building.




