


The Event

On Saturday June 19th, members, family, and friends of the Rotary and Rotaract Club of Shanghai joined the You Dao Foundation's gift bag packing event. Originally set for 20 volunteers, the event attracted over 40 enthusiastic helpers, including children, to pack 1300 gift bags for migrant-family children in the mountainous areas of Yunnan province.

The Inspiration

According to the organizers, the gift giving was inspired by visits to villages in the remote mountain areas of Heqing Country, Dali Yunnan. They were struck by the lack of playfulness and sad facial expressions in the children they met. A few simple games and warm gestures com-





pletely brightened their day. However, improving their living conditions and developing wellbeing requires continued action.

The Action

After a quick orientation and demonstration, volunteers were grouped and assigned

schools. Classified based on age groups, the gifts included fun children's educational toys for enjoyment during their summer vacation. The volunteers were eager to sort, label, and pack. There was a valuable lesson to be learned as we traversed language barriers and different approaches to collaboration. The teams quickly adapted an efficient assembly line approach resulting in most bags being packed before a delicious beef and chicken lunch sponsored by the You Dao Foundation.

As we observed young children packing gift bags, we were touched





by their reflection of the nature of the toys compared to their hightech devices. They were interested in the jump-ropes and rubrics cubes because they "looked fun!" Parents ensured their children not only recognized their advantages in life, but fostered empathy for those with less and a character of taking action when possible.



Dean contributed his best 25 years to Rotary starting with San Jose, then Spokane 21 — Fremount/Union City/Newark, he moved to China since 2005 making his home in different area of the country. Dean joined Rotary club of Shanghai since 2009 and became the president of 2015/2016. He, together with us, all Rotarians and fellows, developed Rotary paths and accomplished multi-levels charity projects in China. Meanwhile, he encouraged, inspired, helped the young generations of Rotarian with respectful all the way as he could.

He spent his last years in Sanya since 2018, a city on Hainan island in South China after his retirement from Rotary, but again, to pursue his lifelong passion for protecting the environment, in 2020, he became the co-founder of Zero Waste Sanya — a grassroots movement that aims to eliminate all landfill waster to create a better future, until he passed away.
