We have received photos of the Oxygen Generating Plant (OGP) installation and handover to the hospital in Calcutta, India.

Our project contact, PP Shahul of RC Singapore visited the ISPAT Hospital on March 8th. This US\$138,337 Covid relief project is a joint effort of 30 partners: Rotary Clubs (7 Clubs in China including RC Shanghai), Rotarians and NGO.

With the OGP being done, we just wait for the local club RC Calcutta Metropolitan to file the final report of this global grant to TRF, as soon as a few of the remaining medical devices are in place.
