

Snowland Art School

Snowland is located in Xiahe, Gansu province of China. It's only a couple of hundred meters from Labrang Monastery, which is famous for its thangkas (traditional tibetan art).

Snowland teaches tibetan students from 18 year olds and above, both men and women. Most of them come from nomadic families, and few are encouraged to follow the path to becoming an artist. They have all worked hard, and fought to be able to do what they love: pain.

At the school they learn both the traditional buddhist art, thangka, and western art, focusing on perspective and proportions. The program lasts for five years, and after graduations students can go on to pass on their skills through teaching, some are illustrators for children's books and some have found other creative ways to practice their art.
