Dr. Rosen plays an integral role at ELG as founder, director, and senior consultant at the Essential Learning Group, Shanghai. Dr. Rosen saw the need for specialized services in 2003 when she began working with families and organizations across Shanghai, which led to the founding of ELG in 2006. Dr. Rosen is currently the Director of Programs. In addition, Dr. Rosen provides trainings to parents, educators, and medical professionals. She is a member of the American Speech and Hearing Association, the International Association of Logopedics, the International Association of Special Education, and the International Schools Counselors Association. She serves on the Advisory Board of Lifeline, Shanghai.

Dr. Rosen has received many prestigious awards, including the inaugural SENIA Advocacy Award in 2014 and the International Professional Women’s Society’s Social Contributor of the Year Award in 2017. She was selected as one of China’s 2021 Superwomen.

Dr. Rosen has a unique understanding of learning disabilities, based on her personal experience, is passionate about helping individuals with unique learning needs.
